MANAGER'S REPORT

1. New Museum Building Presentation

Elsie Needles invited the public to attend a groundbreaking for the new Colorado River Museum to be held on May 2nd at Community Park. Karole Finkelstein said someone came forward with a large donation that enabled the new museum building construction to start. She thanked the community for everything they have done in support of the museum. Larry Adams thanked the generous benefactor that stepped up. He said this was the first phase of an ongoing project, and said the museum would be a valuable addition to Community Park. He commended the Museum's Board of Directors and all of the volunteers. He said the city building department really helped enable them to start construction by June 1st. He displayed drawings of the proposed museum building.

Elsie Needles said the current museum was located at Davis Park in a building that was built in 1947. She said when they moved into the building; Tom Brady signed their lease with Mohave County. She said they celebrated their 25th Anniversary last year, and said they had closed every summer because of air conditioning issues. She said it was a coincidence that Tom Brady was now Mayor and there to see the new museum built in Community Park.

City Manager Cotter said the city was budgeting to pay the building's utility costs, and said museum volunteers would manage the museum operations.

Mayor Brady said the county signed the lease 25 years ago and said the museum had been run for so long in an old building. He said the new museum would be a wonderful addition to the community. He said it had been a blessing to see the history of Bullhead City.

2. EPCOR Water Acquisition Update

City Manager Cotter said Agenda Items No. 5 and 6 were added as an amendment to the original agenda and said the Council would discuss them later that evening.

Council Member Wegmann reminded the community that the Bullhead Area Chamber of Commerce would hold their mixer on May 3rd with a Cinco de Mayo theme.

Mayor Brady said Governor Ducey attended a Patriots Dinner in Kingman last weekend. He said Mohave County Supervisor Angius set up a roundtable meeting with elected officials beforehand. He said three city mayors, four county supervisors, and other officials attended this meeting to discuss mutual issues. He said the meeting was very productive.

2. Discussion and possible action to modify the Community Park Plan of Development by removing the island from the plan. (Parks and Recreation Superintendent Heath)

City Manager Cotter said a Council workshop to discuss this issue was held in April that began with a tour of Community Park. He said they went back to the public hearing process over the past few years and discovered the island was not a priority of the public.

Parks and Recreation Superintendent Heath said the Parks and Recreation Commission discussed the idea of the island and realized it was too cost prohibitive to move forward. He said the Commissioners voted 4-0 to recommend removal of the island.

3. Discussion and possible action to approve a budget amendment from "Non-Departmental Contingency" to fund the feasibility study on the establishment of a mountain bike trail system in Bullhead City. (Parks and Recreation Superintendent Heath)

Parks and Recreation Superintendent Heath said he met with Parks and Recreation Commissioner Petrillo and Greg Riordan regarding the possibility of establishing mountain biking trails in Bullhead City. He said that meeting led to a meeting with Patrick Kell from the International Mountain Biking Association at which time they explored topics such as funding for the project, location of trails, and economic impact. He said the Parks and Recreation Commission voted 4-0 to move forward with the recommendation to enter into an agreement to conduct a feasibility study for the establishment of a mountain bike trail system. He thanked Vice Mayor Clark for bringing some valuable insights into their communications.

Greg Riordan said the economic impact was great and said most mountain bikers visited other locations. He said Lake Havasu City and Kingman had many miles of mountain bike trails, and said Bullhead City should be another destination for mountain bikers.

Council Member D'Amico asked if the study would determine the locations of the trails. City Manager Cotter said the main purpose of the study was to develop trails and look at the feasibility of the surrounding acreage.

Council Member Ring asked about the five and four-star trail ratings. Mr. Riordan said he did not know, but said the ratings could represent the trail features and experience levels.

Vice Mayor Clark said he was very much in favor of the proposal. He said the trails would work beautifully with the city's philosophy in partnering with the Laughlin casinos for increased tourism.

Mayor Brady asked if anyone from the public wanted to speak. No one from the public spoke.

He said the city agreed that "Championship Boulevard" would be an appropriate name that met the city's street naming criteria.
